

Kimberly's Canvas Tutorial



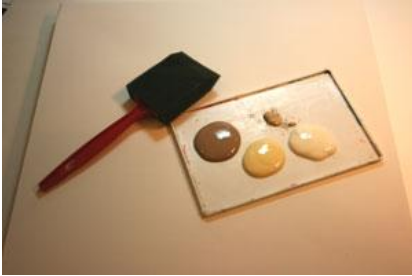
Canvas Supplies:

- 12x12 Canvas Stretched
- 12x6 Designer Paper
- Modge Podge Matte Finish
- Acrylic Paint
- Two Sponge Brushes
- Paint Trays
- Stamp set of choice
- Horizontal Slit Punch
- Neutral cardstock
- Coordinating cardstock
- Rub Ons
- Felt Flurries
- Metal Decorative Brads
- Chipboard Accents
- Ribbon

Photo: Any photo size will do. Photo must be professionally developed.

Step1:

Choose 4 complimentary colors of Acrylic Paint.



Step 2:

Use long even strokes to paint your canvas. Make sure none of the canvas shows through your paint. Use the darker shade of paint around the edges for a nice contrast.



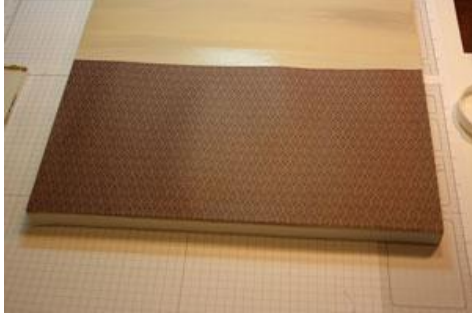
Step 3:

Paint your chipboard using the same Acrylic Paint colors. Let dry.



Step 4:

Using a foam brush, lightly coat canvas with Modge Podge where you will place the Designer Paper. Place the 6 x 12 Designer paper over the Modge Podge area. Lightly press any air bubbles out using your finger. Let dry. Tip: If you notice a lot of air bubbles you probably have TOO much Modge Podge. Place a small amount of Modge Podge on your finger and press air out lightly.



Step 5:

Using foam brush, lightly apply Modge Podge to the back of your picture. Place picture onto canvas and lightly press out bubbles. Apply Modge Podge over pictures. Let dry. Note: Pictures will appear milky white. Make sure to use even strokes when applying Modge Podge for a finished look.



Step 6:

Apply Rub ons to neutral cardstock. Stamp image lightly over rub ons. Adhere onto coordinating cardstock. Punch two slits using Horizontal slit punch. *I used the Winter Post Stamp Set.



Step 7:

Wrap ribbon around canvas and tie into square knot.



Step 8:

Add embellishments to canvas. I used the Felt Flurries, Decorative Brads and additional rub ons.



Step 9:

Complete embellished chipboard by adding large snow flurry to chipboard with decorative brad. Punch hole into chipboard and hang from ribbon.



Step 10:

Apply rub on to neutral cardstock and cut corners to make a paper banner. Stamp coordinating image. Adhere banner using glue dots onto canvas.



Finished Project:



Tips & Tricks: If you stamp onto your canvas use a Pigment Ink. Place a hard surface underneath the canvas so you can add pressure when stamping. Rub ons can be added before or after Modge Podge.
